### **Child Care:**

A Day Care Centre - St. Mary's School is run by the trust to impart education to the less privileged children to nurture the poor children in education and good health. 50 children in the age group of 2.5 to 6 years are enrolled in the Day Care centre and the Centre runs a school with Pre K.G, L.K.G and U.K.G classes. 19 Children belonging to class of I, II and VI are sponsored by the trust to the nearby school- The Little Flower English Medium School. The day care centre staffs 9 personnel.

The St. Mary's School commenced the academic year from the first week of June 2008; the classes are held from 8.30 am to 12.30 pm. Day Care Centre known as St. Mary's School provides mid day meal with milk and bikis to every student besides free medical assistance. Uniforms and other gifts are given in six monthly interval.

To create additional income for the women cooking utensils are provided to families such that they can run eateries from their own homes. Push carts are also provided to sell hygienically cooked food. We have a tailor training program for the women of the neighborhood.



Tailoring a Future

Young women training program is a project for the young women in the villages, 10 young women are being trained as domestic workers. After the completion of their course, a certificate is given and a sewing machine is also gifted to all participants. Therefore we request and expect all of your constant support and encouragement. These are all steps aimed at augmenting house hold incomes.
